Digital art bridging the culture divide The Vernacular Terrain launches in Brisbane August 2007

International Digital Art Projects, QUT Precincts, Yokohama Art Project (Japan) and Beijing Film Academy (China) presents **The Vernacular Terrain**; an innovative exhibition exploring environment and political and cultural place.

Fresh from an exclusive preview exhibition in Yokohama, Japan, **The Vernacular Terrain** will be on show to Brisbane audiences from today for a limited time before heading to China for its final stop for 2007.

This year's project features over 45 national and international artists with an array of award-winning and premiere works crossing a broad practice of video, interactive media, installation and photo-media art.

Brisbane animation artist **Chris Denaro** will be an artist-in-residence, working in situ throughout the exhibition to create a unique and constantly evolving artwork.

Award winning Australian artists **David Rosetzky**, **James Lynch**, **Brendan Lee**, **Magda Matwiejew** and **Monika Tichacek** will be featured alongside impressive international names like **Peter Greenaway** (UK), **Istvan Horkay** (HU), **Ben Hibon** (UK), **Marco Fantini** (IT) and **Song Dong** (PRC).

The Vernacular Terrain will feature Tichacek's award-winning and controversial video *The Shadows* while the Greenaway/Horkay collaborative team will debut six new video works from their epic *Bolzano Gold Project*.

Embracing the talents of the Asia Pacific region, **The Vernacular Terrain** will also present works from leading contemporary Chinese artists Maleonn, Cui Xuiwen and Wang Hong Hai's *My Dream*, which premiered at the 2007 Cannes Film Festival.

The print component features at QUT Art Museum, while the Creative Industries Precinct at QUT Kelvin Grove will play host to the extensive new media exhibition in its purpose-built fully wired tech space The Block.
